6. Legislation
 - a. AB 1239 tire recycling; \$1 per tire as incentive payments to processors and end users; failed.
 - b. SB 1229 provides civil immunity to pharmacies that run take back programs for sharps & pharmaceuticals; approved, signed by Governor.
 - c. AB 2530 requires producers of beverages sold in plastic bottles to label the container with the average percentage of recycled content in the bottle; approved.
 - d. AB 1005 extends the Plastic Market Development program that sunsets this year; approved.
 - a. SB 1383 implements ARB's Short Lived Climate Pollutant Strategy, including methane. The bill includes a plan to reduce the landfilling of organic waste by 50% by 2020 and 75% by 2025. By 2020 CalRecycle and ARB will analyze progress in achieving the goals, including infrastructure status, financing and rates, markets and regulatory barriers. CalRecycle shall adopt regulations effective 2022. The regulations may require local agencies to impose requirements on generators, including fines. May include different levels of requirements for local jurisdictions and phased timelines based upon their progress in meeting the organic waste reduction goals for 2020 and 2025; and may include CalRecycle penalties for noncompliance. The bill also includes a goal to recover 20% of the edible food, to be part of CalRecycle's regulations; approved.
 - b. SB 778 will reduce unnecessary oil changes by requiring shops to give their customers accurate information on how often they need an oil change for their specific car; approved.
 - c. AB 1419 addresses an emerging barrier to the recycling of electronic waste by opening up new allowable recycling uses for the glass that comes from old CRT monitors and TVs; approved.
 - d. AB 1613 invests funds generated from the sale of cap-and-trade allowances to reduce greenhouse gases. The funding includes \$40 million for organic waste processing infrastructure, food waste prevention, and recycled content manufacturing, as well as \$7.5 million to establish a Healthy Soils program to support carbon sequestration through compost application and other strategies; approved.
